Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to State:

- a) the main features of 'PM Atma Nirbhar Swasth Bharat Yojana' along with its present status thereof;
- b) whether the Government has sanctioned and released any funds under the said scheme so far in Rajasthan and if so, the details thereof;
- c) the details of the targets fixed under the said scheme;
- d) whether the Government proposes to upgrade/ modernise the Primary Health Centres set up in remote/ rural areas under the said Scheme; and
- e) if so, the details thereof and the time proposed to be taken in commencement of this scheme?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH & FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

(a) to (e):

In the Budget speech of FY 21-22, 'Prime Minister Atmanirbhar Swasth Bharat Yojana' (PMASBY) scheme has been announced on 1st February, 2021, for an outlay of about

Rs.64,180 Cr over six years (till FY 25-26). This will be in addition to the National Health Mission.

The main interventions envisaged under the scheme, to be achieved by FY 25-26, are:

- N Support for 17,788 rural Health and Wellness Centres in in 10 High Focus States
- N Establishing 11,024 urban Health and Wellness Centres in all the States.
- N Setting up of Integrated Public Health Labs in all districts and 3382 Block Public Health Units in 11 High Focus states;
- N Establishing Critical Care Hospital Blocks in 602 districts and 12 Central Institutions;
- N Strengthening of the National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), its 5 regional branches and 20 metropolitan health surveillance units;
- N Expansion of the Integrated Health Information Portal to all States/UTs to connect all public health labs;
- N Operationalisation of 17 new Public Health Units and strengthening of 33 existing Public Health Units at Points of Entry, that is at 32 Airports, 11 Seaports and 7 land crossings;
- N Setting up of 15 Health Emergency Operation Centres and 2 mobile hospitals; and
- Netting up of a national institution for One Health, a Regional Research Platform for WHO South East Asia Region, 9 Bio-Safety Level III laboratories and 4 regional National Institutes for Virology.
