Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of proposals received and approved under phase III of the centrally sponsored scheme for establishing new medical colleges in aspirational and backward districts attached with existing district/referral hospitals, State/UT wise, especially in Jharkhand;
- (b) the districts whose proposals are under consideration for establishing new medical colleges under the said scheme;
- (c)the details of medical colleges established in such districts/areas under phase I and II of the said scheme along with the funds allocated and utilised for the purpose, State/UT-wise;
- (d)the reasons for delay if any, in establishing the medical colleges under the said scheme, State/UT-wise, particularly in Jharkhand and Rajasthan; and
- (e)the status of completion of work of each of such medical colleges approved under the said scheme as on date?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

(a) & (b) Under Phase-III of Centrally Sponsored Scheme(CSS) namely 'Establishment of new Medical Colleges attached with existing district/referralhospitals', the Ministry had received 27 proposal from States/UTs for establishing new medical colleges in aspirational districts. Out of which, 21 proposals have been approved based on the criteria of Scheme. List of these approved

medical colleges is at Annexure – I. Further, under Phase-III of the Scheme, all the 75 approved medical colleges have already been allocated and therefore, no further proposals are under consideration.

- (c) List of approved medical colleges in aspirational districts under Phase-I and Phase-II of the said Scheme is at Annexure-II.
- (d) & (e) Under the Scheme, a total 157 medical colleges have been sanctioned, out of which, 47 have become functional. The concerned State/UT Governments are the implementing agencies under the Scheme. As per information provided by the States/UTs, the works of the remaining medical colleges are at various stages of completion. The State-wise list of 47 medical colleges that have become functional is at Annexure-III.
