- (a) the number of times central tax was increased on petroleum products such as petrol, diesel and LPG during January 2019 to January 2021;

- (c) whether there is any mechanism for assessing the impact of increase in prices of petrol and diesel on general public?

# MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS (SHRI RAMESWAR TELI)

(a) & (b): The central taxes on petrol and diesel have been increased three times during the period January 2019 to January 2021. There has been no increase in central tax on LPG during the same period.

The amount of tax being collected from petrol and diesel (at Delhi) per litre as on 28.07.2021 is given below:

Elements	Unit	Petrol	Diesel
Excise Duty	Rs/Ltr	32.90	31.80
VAT	Rs/Ltr	23.50	13.14

(c): The impact of increase in prices of petrol and diesel can be seen in their impact on inflationary trends measured by Wholesale Price Index (WPI). The weightage of petrol and diesel in the WPI index is 1.60% and 3.10% respectively.

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
