ANTYODAYA YOJANA IN RAJASTHAN

Will the Minister of CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION उपभोक्ता मामले, खाद्य और सार्वजनिक वितरण मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) the salient features and details of Antyodaya Yojana;
- (b) the funded sanctioned, allocation and utilized in Rajastan under the said scheme during the last three years;
- (c) the number of beneficiaries in each district of Rajasthan including Sikar, Jhunjhunu and Churu; and
- (d) the details of the criteria fixed to receive the benefit of the said scheme?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD & PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION (SADHVI NIRANJAN JYOTI)

(a): The Antyodaya Anna Yojana(AAY) was introduced by the Government in December, 2000, for 1 crore poorest of poor families across the country to be identified from amongst the Below Poverty Line (BPL) families under the Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS) in all States/UTs at that time. Since then, the coverage under AAY has been expanded three times i.e. during 2003-04, 2004-05 and 2005-06, covering additional 50 lakh households each time. Thus, increasing the total coverage under AAY up to 2.50 crore families. Presently, under the National Food Security Act, 2013 (NFSA), the AAY families are entitled to receive 35kg of foodgrains per family per month at a highly subsidized issue prices of Rs. 3/2/1- per kg for rice, wheat and coarse grains respectively.

- (b): This Department allocates only subsidized foodgrains to States/UTs for monthly distribution to all NFSA ration card holders, including AAY families, instead of allocation of funds. Details of foodgrains distributed by States/UTs under NFSA are shared with this Department for settlement, etc. Further, it is stated that Rajasthan has not submitted any subsidy claims during the last three years.
- (c): As per information available from the State, about 6,25,920 families are covered in all districts of Rajasthan. District wise number of beneficiaries covered as on July, 2021 is annexed.
- (d): As per the guidelines issued by the Government for AAY scheme, the State/UT Governments identify eligible households for inclusion under AAY as per the following identification criteria:
- (i) Landless agriculture labourers, marginal farmers, rural artisans /craftsmen, such as potters, tanners, weavers, blacksmiths, carpenters, slum dwellers and persons earning their livelihood on daily basis in the informal sector like porters, coolies, rickshaw pullers, hand cart pullers, fruit and flower sellers, snake charmers, rag pickers, cobblers, destitute and other similar categories in both rural and urban areas;
- (ii) Households headed by widows or terminally ill persons/disabled persons/ persons aged 60 years or more with no assured means of subsistence or societal support;
- (iii) Widows or terminally ill persons or disabled persons or persons aged 60 years or more or single women or single men with no family or societal support or assured means of subsistence;
- (iv) All primitive tribal households;
- (v) All eligible Below Poverty Line (BPL) families of HIV positive persons.
