Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the number of stressed small and micro enterprises in Uttar Pradesh during the period of COVID-19;
- (b) the details of small companies declared unsolvent in Uttar Pradesh during the said period; and
- (c) the details of the steps taken by the Government to revive them?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (SHRI NARAYAN RANE)

(a) & (b): The Reserve Bank of India issued guidelines on 'Framework for Revival and Rehabilitation (FRR) of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises' to Scheduled Commercial Banks (excluding Regional Rural Banks) in March 2016, the concept of sickness no longer exists. Under this Framework, banks have been advised to identify incipient stress (well before the account turns in to sick category as per the earlier definition) in the MSME accounts and refer it to the Committees formed under the Framework for suitable Corrective Action Plan viz. rectification, restructuring and recovery. The number of Accounts referred to the Committee and Accounts resolved by the committee for the half year ended March, 2017 to half year ended September, 2020 are:
