PMGSY IN TAMIL NADU

339. SHRI S. VENKATESAN:

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of colonies connected so far under Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) in the country, along with the district-wise details in respect of Tamil Nadu including Madurai; and
- (b) the number of roads identified under PMGSY during the said period?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SADHVI NIRANJAN JYOTI)

(a)& (b) Rural Roads is a State subject. Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) was launched as a one-time special intervention to support enhancement of rural connectivity, by way of a single all-weather road, to the eligible unconnected habitations of designated population size (500+ in plain areas and 250+ in North-Eastern States, Himalayan States and Himalayan Union Territories as per 2001 census) in the core network for uplifting the socio-economic condition of the rural population. Relaxation has been provided to the Tribal (Schedule V) areas and Selected Tribal and Backward Districts (as identified by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) and Planning Commission), and unconnected habitations in these areas with a population of 250 persons and above in the Core Network as per Census 2001 are eligible for connectivity under the scheme. In the critical Left Wing Extremism affected blocks (as identified by Ministry of Home Affairs), additional relaxation has been given to connect habitations with population 100 persons and above as per 2001 census.

The unit for PMGSY programme is habitation. Against 1,78,184 habitations of the population size 250+ and 500+ identified for coverage under PMGSY, 16,086 habitations have been provided connectivity by the States/UTs out of their own resources and 4,716 habitations have either been dropped or have not been found feasible. Out of the balance 1,57,382 habitations sanctioned for providing connectivity under the PMGSY, 1,55,245 habitations have already been provided connectivity. In the State of Tamilnadu, 1,985 habitations of 500+ and 1,000+ population size were sanctioned for coverage under PMGSY and all the habitations have already been connected. The district-wise details of habitations sanctioned and connected in the State of Tamilnadu, including Madurai are attached as **Annexure**.

The mandate of PMGSY has been subsequently widened to include new interventions. PMGSY-II was launched in the year 2013, with a target to upgrade 50,000 Kms of the existing rural road network to improve its overall efficiency as a provider of transportation services for people, goods and services. Road Connectivity Project for Left Wing Extremism Affected Areas (RCPLWEA) was launched in the year 2016 for construction/upgradation of strategically

important roads chosen in the 44 worst affected LWE districts and adjoining districts in the 9 States of Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Telangana and Uttar Pradesh. PMGSY-III was launched in the year 2019 for consolidation of 1,25,000 Km Through Routes and Major Rural Links connecting habitations, inter-alia, to Gramin Agricultural Markets (GrAMs), Higher Secondary Schools and Hospitals.

The status of implementation of various interventions/verticals of PMGSY across the country and in the Tamilnadu State and Madurai district as on 15th July, 2021 is as under:-
