- (c) whether the Government has received any proposal regarding financial assistance for a new price repository centre of the State Government of Maharashtra;
- (d) if so, the details along with the present status thereof; and
- (e) the time by which, it is likely to be approved?

(a) to (e): There are 5 price reporting centres in Maharashtra under the scheme, Strengthening of Price Monitoring Cell wherein, funds are released to States/UTs on the basis of proposals sent by them. An amount of Rs.6,37,097/- was released during 2020-21 to the Government of Maharashtra as financial assistance for the price reporting centres. The Department of Consumer Affairs received a proposal from the State Government for 4 new price reporting centres which were approved *in principle* for reporting daily retail and wholesale prices on trial basis. Thereafter, upon satisfactory fulfilment of the requisite conditions, one of proposed centres namely, Mangaon in Raigad District has been added to the list of price reporting centres in Maharashtra.
