MEASURES FOR THE PREVENTION OF HEPATITIS B

784. SHRI MOHANBHAI KALYANJI KUNDARIYA: SHRI ANIL FIROJIYA:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has taken any measures for the prevention of fatal disease like Hepatitis B;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether any effective treatment is available for a person infected with Hepatitis B; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

- (a) & (b): National Viral Hepatitis Control Program (NVHCP) was launched in 2018 in alignment with Sustainable Development Goal (SDG). The scope of the program was expanded to include management of Hepatitis B in 2019. In order to prevent Hepatitis B, screening is done during Ante-Natal Care (ANC) of pregnant women for Hepatitis B as well. It is a vaccine preventable disease and the program, in coordination with immunization division, is ensuring Hepatitis B birth dose vaccine and Hepatitis B Immunoglobulin to babies born to Hepatitis B positive mothers. Hepatitis B vaccine is also part of Universal Immunization Programme. The program envisages prevention through awareness generation, and management of viral hepatitis 'B' by providing free diagnosis and drugs across the board.
- (c) & (d): Lifelong treatment of Hepatitis B is available free of cost under NVHCP for those who require the same.
