STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) & (b) OF STARRED QUESTION NO.167 ANSWERED IN THE LOK SABHA ON 09.12.2021 REGARDING SHORTAGE OF COAL IN POWER PLANTS

- (a): Yes, Sir. Ministry of Power, in April, 2020 had advised Generating Companies who were importing coal for blending purpose to make best efforts to replace their imports with domestic Coal.
- (b): NTPC did not place any fresh order for procurement of imported coal during the FY 2020-21 and had also reduced package quantities of its various contracts for procuring imported coal.

To ensure adequate coal stock during the current FY i.e., 2021-22, NTPC has enhanced package quantity of running contracts by 1.42 Million Metric Tonnes (MMT) for blending of domestic coal with imported Coal.
