- (a) the new accounts opened under the Sukanya Samriddhi Yojana (SSY) since 2018, which was launched to provide stable collections for future expenses of the female children;
- (b) the details of States with the highest and lowest number of accounts opened under the scheme along with the reasons therefor; and
- (c) the details of the distribution proportion of private and public scheduled banks opening accounts under the scheme?

- (a) The number of new accounts opened under Sukanya Samriddhi Account (SSA) from 01.04.2018 to 31.10.2021 is 1,42,73,910.
- (b) The details of States with the highest and lowest number of account under SSA as on 31.10.2021 is given below:
