Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Deen Dayal Upadhyay-Grameen Kaushal Yojana (DDU-GKY) is being implemented by the Government in the country and if so, the details thereof, State-wise including Maharashtra;
- (b) whether the youth in rural areas of Thane, Jalgaon, Kolhapur, Sangli, Ahmednagar, Nandurbar, Usmanabad, Marathwada including Parbhani and Ramtek Parliamentary Constituency and from districts of Vidharbha are being imparted training under the said scheme, if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether the youth are getting financial benefits and adequate employment opportunities after completing the training;
- (d) the details regarding the number of youth who have been imparted training and those out of them, who got employed after completion of training;
- (e) the method through which training is being imparted under DDU-GKY; and
- (f) whether any special education project has been formulated for the said youth and if so, the details thereof?

**ANSWER**

(a) & (d) The Deen Dayal Upadhyay-Grameen Kaushal Yojana (DDU-GKY) is being implemented by the Government, which is a placement linked skill development program for rural poor youth in the age group of 15-35 years since September, 2014. DDU-GKY guidelines provide for earmarking 50% of the funds for SCs and STs and 15% for minorities. Further, one third beneficiaries of the respective categories under the scheme should be women.

DDU-GKY follows a 3-tier implementation architecture for implementation. National level is responsible for policy, funding of central share and technical support, while State Rural Livelihood Missions (SRLMs)/ State Skills Missions are responsible for funding of State share, implementation and monitoring controls. Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs), which are mostly private training partners, are responsible for mobilization, training and placements. State-wise details including Maharashtra is as given at **Annexure-I**

(b) The scheme is being implemented in the State of Maharashtra including Thane, Jalgaon, Kolhapur, Sangli, Ahmednagar, Nandurbar, Usmanabad, Marathwada including Parbhani and Ramtek Parliamentary Constituencies and districts of Vidharbha region. District-wise details are given at **Annexure-II**

(c) In Maharashtra, under DDU-GKY a total number of 44,938 beneficiaries have been successfully imparted the training and out of which 33,026 beneficiaries have been provided with the employment till date.

(e) Under DDU-GKY training is being imparted to the youth based on the qualification packs, approved by National Skills Qualification Committee of the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship. The training consists of theory, practical and on-job training imparted in domain skills. Additionally computer skills, english skills and life skills are also imparted to make the trainees adapt better to the work environment.
