### LOK SABHA UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 1865 TO BE ANSWERED ON 09.12.2021

#### **DRINKING WATER CRISIS**

#### †1865. SHRIMATI RANJEETA KOLI:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is aware of the serious drinking water crisis due to constantly decreasing water table in various States of the country including Rajasthan;
- (b) if so, the details of the schemes being implemented by the Government to deal with this situation;
- (c) the details of funds spent under various drinking water schemes in all the districts of Rajasthan including Sikar district during the last three years, district-wise;
- (d) whether the Government proposes to implement any special scheme regarding drinking water for all the districts of Rajasthan including Bharatpur district; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

#### ANSWER

## THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI (SHRI PRAHLAD SINGH PATEL)

(a) to (e) As reported by States/ UTs, as on 07.12.2021, out of 17.01 lakh rural habitations in the country, 13.46 lakh (79.10%) having 79.43% population have provision of potable drinking water with supply level of more than 40 litre per capita per day (lpcd) and 3.18 lakh (18.73%) rural habitations having 18.81% population with supply level of less than 40 lpcd with sources at a reasonable distance and 0.37 lakh (2.17%) rural habitations having 1.76% population are reported to have water quality issues in drinking water sources. State/ UT-wise details including those in Rajasthan is at **Annex–I**. In the ministry, no such report indicating serious drinking water crisis in the country including in Rajasthan, has been received.

Since August 2019, Government of India, in partnership with States, is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) for making provision of potable tap water supply to every rural household, including those in all the districts which *inter alia* include Sikar and Bharatpur districts of Rajasthan, by 2024. The estimated outlay of the mission is Rs. 3.60 lakh Crore, out of which Central share is Rs. 2.08 lakh Crore. Powers to plan, approve and implement water supply schemes under Jal Jeevan Mission is vested with respective State Governments.

Under Jal Jeevan Mission, district-wise fund allocation is not made and maintained at the Government of India level. However, details of Central fund allocated, fund drawn and fund utilization reported by the State of Rajasthan under Jal Jeevan Mission in 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22 (as on 06.12.2021) is at **Annex – II**.
