- (a) whether the Union Government has fixed target of hundred per cent scientific processing and disposal of solid waste under 'Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM)';**
- (b) if so, the details thereof;**
- (c) the action being taken by the Government in this regard; and**
- (d) whether any road map is under process for future and if so, the details thereof?**

(a) to (d) : Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban (SBM-U) 2.0, has been launched on 01st October, 2021. The following specific objectives are targeted to be achieved under SBM-U 2.0.

...2/-

- (i). Ensuring cleanliness and hygiene in public places to make all cities clean and garbage free, with 100% scientific processing of MSW.**
- (ii). Reducing air pollution arising out of SWM activities, through effective management of C&D waste, and mechanical sweeping.**
- (iii). Phased reduction in use of single-use plastic.**
- (iv). Remediation of all legacy dumpsites.**

SBM-U 2.0, provides for bottom-up planning wherein cities will draw up action plans for addressing the entire Solid Waste Management (SWM) value chain, including remediation of legacy dumpsites, greater focus on Construction & Demolition (C&D) waste management, and intensified focus on source segregation and processing of all segregated waste fractions, including plastic waste. SBM-U 2.0 provides for intensive capacity building of stakeholders and also sustained focus on Jan Andolan for sanitation outcomes. The State-wise details of Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) generated and processed is given in the Annexure.
