Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Jal Shakti Abhiyan is launched by the Government on World Water Day and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the funds allocated and spent under this abhiyan so far;
- (c) the number of persons who joined this abhiyan and the work done so far; and
- (d) the details of work executed in the State of Rajasthan especially Udaipur district and the benefits drawn therefrom?

**ANSWER**

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI

(SHRI BISHWESWAR TUDU)

(a) Yes, Sir. The “Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch The Rain” (JSA:CTR) campaign was launched by Hon’ble Prime Minister on 22 March 2021, the World Water Day, with the theme – “Catch The Rain, Where it falls, When it falls”. JSA:CTR has been taken up in all districts (rural as well as urban areas) of the country during the pre-monsoon and monsoon period in the country i.e. from 22nd March 2021 to 30th November 2021.

JSA:CTR has been implemented with **five** focused interventions- (1) **intensive rainwater harvesting and water conservation** which include making of roof-top Rain Water Harvesting Structures (RWHS) on buildings and water harvesting pits in compounds; maintenance of existing RWHS & creation of new check dams/ponds; renovation of traditional WHS; removal of encroachments of tanks/lakes and in their catchment channels; de-silting of tanks, reuse and recharge of borewells; watershed development; rejuvenation of small rivers and rivulets; revival of wetlands and protection of flood-banks etc; (2) **enumerating, geo-tagging & making inventory of all water bodies; preparation of scientific plans for water conservation based on it** (3) **Setting up of Jal Shakti Kendras in all districts** (4) **intensive afforestation** and (5) **awareness generation**.

(b) & (c) The campaign is a convergence of many schemes and stakeholders. The budget provided by Central government, State Governments, Finance Commission grants and locally mobilized funds are used to undertake the works. Funds spent and work done during the JSA : CTR campaign so far, as uploaded in the designated portal, is attached as **Annexure-I**.

Besides this, National Water Mission, Ministry of Jal Shakti is providing incentive-based financial grant up to Rs.2.00 lakh to each district for preparing scientific GIS plan. Initially, Rs. 1.00 lakh is given as financial grant and remaining Rs. 1.00 lakh is given based on the performance and quality of work done in this planning process in each district. Till date, Rs.1.77 crore have been disbursed to 177 districts.

It may not be possible to quantify the number of persons who joined this campaign. However, the campaign has been implemented with people's active participation and with the aim to make "**Jal Andolan**" a "**Jan Andolan**". National Water Mission, Ministry of Jal Shakti has tied up with various Central Government Departments/ Ministries, State Governments, Universities, Educational Institutions, Banks, Railway Board, Airport Authority of India, Central Armed Police Forces, IITs, IIMs, NGOs etc for their participation.

(d) Details of work executed in Rajasthan and in Udaipur District and benefits drawn so far (as on 06.12.2021) therefrom is attached as **Annexure-II**.
