2003. SHRIMATI RITA BAHUGUNA JOSHI: SHRI TALARI RANGAIAH:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has introduced the Har Ghar Jal Scheme and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the details of number of households in the country that got covered under the "Nal se Jal" scheme during the last one year; State-wise;
- (c) whether the Government has fixed any timeline to cover all the ancient cities like Allahabad to provide 100 per cent Nal se Jal to every household; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI (SHRI PRAHLAD SINGH PATEL)

(a) to (d) Since August, 2019, Government of India in partnership with States, is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) – Har Ghar Jal, to make provision of potable tap water supply to every rural household in the country by 2024. Since launch of mission more than 5.38 Crore rural households have been provided tap water connection. Thus, as on 05.12.2021, out of total 19.22 Crore rural households in the country, now 8.61 Crore (44.84%) households have provision of tap water supply. The State/ UT-wise details of households provided with tap water connection since April, 2020, is **annexed.** The Government of Uttar Pradesh has planned to make provision of tap water supply to every rural household of the State by 2024.
