# LOK SABHA UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 2040 ANSWERED ON 9<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER, 2021

#### **ROAD ACCIDENTS**

#### 2040. SHRI HIBI EDEN:

#### Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

सडक परिवहन और राजमार्ग मंत्री

#### be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of road accidents took place in the country during each of the last three years and the current year, State/UT-wise;
- (b) whether any comparative study has been conducted to ascertain the pattern of road accidents reported inthe developed and other developing countries and if so, the details and outcome thereof;
- (c) the main reasons attributed to high incidence of road accidents along with the efforts being made to check and prevent road accidents in the country;
- (d) whether the Government is aware of the lack of street lights on Container Terminal Road, Ernakulam, Kerala which is causing difficulties to commuters; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof along with the steps being taken to install street lights at the said road?

#### **ANSWER**

#### THE MINISTER OF ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

#### (SHRI NITIN JAIRAM GADKARI)

(a) As per the information available with the Ministry, the total number of road accidents on all roads in the country during the last four calendar years 2017 to 2020 are given in the following table: -

Year	Total Number of Road Accidents (in numbers)
2017	4,64,910
2018	4,67,044

2020	3,66,138

State-UT wise details of total number of road accidents on all roads in the country during the last four calendar years 2017 to 2020 is at Annexure-I.

(b) A comparison of select indicators published in World Road Statistics, 2018 of International Road Federation has been undertaken with the objective of positioning India viz-a-viz other countries in terms of road accidents and corresponding number person killed, injured and rates per lakh people is at Annexure-II.

India ranks 3rd in terms of total accidents, across 199 countries as reported in the World Road Statistics, 2018. India's incidence of accidents is 36 per lakh people which is much lesser than that of many developed and developing countries like USA(684), Japan(393), Iran(365) and Turkey(233).

(c) The major causes of accidents on the National Highways (NHs) are vehicle design and condition, road engineering, over-speeding, drunken driving/ consumption of alcohol & drug, driving on wrong side, jumping red light, Use of mobile phone, etc.

The Ministry has formulated a multi-pronged strategy to address the issue of road safety based on Education, Engineering (both of roads and vehicles), Enforcement and Emergency Care. Accordingly, various initiatives have been taken by the Ministry as detailed below:

#### i. Education:

- a. The Ministry implements a scheme for undertaking publicity measures and awareness campaigns on road safety to create awareness among road users through the electronic media, print media, NGOs etc.
- b. Observance of National Road Safety Month/Week every year for spreading awareness and strengthening road safety.
- c. A Certification Course for Road Safety Auditors has been commenced in Indian Academy of Highway Engineers (IAHE).
- d. Education of general public on traffic rules and their applicability.
- ii. Engineering (both of Roads and vehicles)
  - Road engineering:
  - a. High priority to identification and rectification of black spots (accident prone spots) on national highways.

- b. Road safety has been made an integral part of road design at planning stage.
- c. Ministry has delegated powers to Regional Officers of MORTH for technical approval to the detailed estimates for rectification of identified Road Accident black spots.
- d. Guidelines for pedestrian facilities on National Highways for persons with disabilities have also been issued to all States / UTs.
- Vehicle engineering:
- a. Safety standards for automobiles have been improved in respect of Airbags, Anti-Breaking System (ABS), Tyres, Crash test, Whole Vehicle Safety Conformity of Production (WVSCoP).
- b. Ministry has notified fitment of Speed Limiting devices on all transport vehicles.
- c. Scheme for setting up one model Inspection & Certification Centre in each State/UT with Central assistance for testing the fitness of vehicles through an automated system.

#### iii. Enforcement

- a. The recently passed motor vehicles (Amendment) Act, 2019 provides for strict enforcement through use of technology and further provides for strict penalties for ensuring strict compliance and enhancing deterrence for violation of traffic rules.
- b. Issue of Guidelines for protection of Good Samaritans and draft rules as per MV (Amendment) Act, 2019 has been published.

#### iv. **Emergency care:**

- a. The Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Act, 2019 provides for a scheme for the cashless treatment of victims of the accident during the golden hour.
- b. The National Highways Authority of India has made provisions for ambulances at all toll plazas on the completed corridor of National Highways.
- c. Further, out of this, 297 ambulances have been upgraded to Basic Life Support as per AIS-125 and upgradation for the remaining is under process.
- (d) & (e) Yes, sir. Ministry is taking necessary steps for installation of street lights on container terminal road, Ernakulam.
