#### ATMANIRBHAR CAMPAIGN TO DOUBLE FARMERS INCOME

2657. SHRI ANIL FIROJIYA:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री be pleased to State:

- (a) whether any scheme has been launched under 'Atmanirbhar Campaign' in order to double the income of farmers:
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether sowing of summer season crops has been curtailed in the State of Madhya Pradesh due to lockdown and whether procurement of crops has also been affected due to lockdown; and
- (d) if not, the details of the coverage of sowing and procurement during the summer seasons of the last three years State-wise including the State of Madhya Pradesh?

#### **ANSWER**

Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री (SHRI NARENDRA SINGH TOMAR)

- (a) & (b): Government of India launched the Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan (ABA) on May 12, 2020 to strengthen Infrastructure, Logistics, Capacity Building, Governance and Administrative Reforms for Agriculture. The components of the ABA for DAC&FW are as follows:-
  - I. Agriculture Infrastructure Fund (AIF) Central Sector Scheme of financing facility under Agri Infrastructure Fund is operational from the year 2020--21 to 2029-30. The aim is creation of infrastructure at the farm gate. The scheme provides medium long term debt financing facility for investment in viable projects for post-harvest management Infrastructure and community farming assets through interest subvention and financial support.

- II. The National Beekeeping and Honey Mission (NBHM) Rs.500 crore from 2020-2021 to 2022-2023 is allocated for the sector. The scheme aims at overall promotion and development of scientific beekeeping in the country:
- III. Kisan Credit Card (KCC) KCC saturation drive was started in mid February, 2020 in order to provide universal access to institutional concessional credit to all farmers including Animal Husbandry, Dairy and Fisheries farmers with special focus on coverage of PM-KISAN beneficiaries. So far a total number of 260.60 lakh KCC have been issued with a sanction limit of Rs. 2.77 lakh crore.
  - (c) & (d): During the lockdown, the agriculture sector functioned smoothly as it was ensured that activities related to agriculture such as movement of labour, farm machinery, inputs, logistics etc. were exempted from the lockdown and agriculture related activities carried on as usual. State wise details of area and procurement including state of Madhya Pradesh, for last 3 years are given in the **Annexure**.
