LOSSES OF BSNL & MTNL

Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government telecom companies BSNL and MTNL have been continuously running into losses as compared to the private telecom companies which are making profit;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the policy proposed by the Government to help these PSUs to overcome their losses;
- (d) whether BSNL and MTNL are likely to suffer more losses with the entry of a private TSP in the telecom sector;
- (e) if so, the State-wise details thereof;
- (f) whether the Government is committed to further strengthen the Government telecom network throughout the country;
- (g) if so, the details thereof; and
- (h) if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI DEVUSINH CHAUHAN)

(a) to (h) The details of profit and loss of Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL) and Mahanagar Telephone Nigam Limited (MTNL) for the last five years are as follows:

The losses of BSNL/ MTNL are on account of reduction in revenue and increased competition leading to tariff reduction.

In order to strengthen BSNL and MTNL, the Government approved a revival plan for these PSUs on 23.10.2019. The revival plan inter-alia, includes measures to reduce the Staff cost through a Voluntary Retirement Scheme (VRS) for employees of age 50 years and above, administrative allotment of spectrum for providing 4G services with funding through budgetary allocation, monetisation of non-core and core assets to generate resources to retire debt, meet CAPEX and other requirements, debt restructuring by raising of Sovereign Guarantee Bonds and in-principle approval for merger of BSNL and MTNL. These measures are expected to help BSNL turn around and remain competitive.
