PROJECTS UNDER SMART CITIES MISSION

NO. 3030. SHRI NATARAJAN P.R.:

Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of number of cities identified as smart cities across the country, State-wise;**
- (b) the details of funds allocated/released so far under the Smart Cities Mission, project-wise;**
- (c) the details of targets fixed for completion of these projects, project-wise; and**
- (d) the details of present status of progress made under the mission as on date, and the reasons for delay in progress, if any?**

- (a) to (d): Government of India launched the Smart Cities Mission (SCM) on 25 June 2015. 100 Smart Cities have been selected through 4 rounds of competition from January 2016 to June 2018. 5,151 projects worth ₹ 2,05,018 crore were proposed by the 100 Smart Cities as part of their Smart City Proposals**

(SCPs). As per SCM Statement & Guidelines, Government of India has to provide financial support to the Mission to the extent of ₹ 48,000 crore over five years i.e. on an average ₹ 100 crore per city per year. An equal amount on a matching basis is to be contributed by the State/Urban Local Body (ULB). Government of India has released ₹ 27,359.60 crore under SCM, out of which ₹ 22,467.81 crore (82%) has already been utilized. As on 12 November 2021, 6,452 projects worth ₹ 1,84,998 crore (90% of total projects) have been tendered; out of which 5,809 projects worth ₹ 1,56,571 crore (85%) are under implementation/completed. The period of implementation of SCM has been extended upto June 2023 and all Smart Cities are expected to complete their projects within the stipulated time.
