PROJECTS UNDER SMART CITIES MISSION

NO. 3030. SHRI NATARAJAN P.R.:

Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of number of cities identified as smart cities across the country, State-wise;
- (b) the details of funds allocated/released so far under the Smart Cities Mission, project-wise;
- (c) the details of targets fixed for completion of these projects, project-wise; and
- (d) the details of present status of progress made under the mission as on date, and the reasons for delay in progress, if any?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS (SHRI KAUSHAL KISHORE)

(a) to (d): Government of India launched the Smart Cities Mission (SCM) on 25 June 2015. 100 Smart Cities have been selected through 4 rounds of competition from January 2016 to June 2018. 5,151 projects worth ₹ 2,05,018 crore were proposed by the 100 Smart Cities as part of their Smart City Proposals

(SCPs). As per SCM Statement & Guidelines, Government of India has to provide financial support to the Mission to the extent of ₹ 48,000 crore over five years i.e. on an average ₹ 100 crore per city per year. An equal amount on a matching basis is to be contributed by the State/Urban Local Body (ULB). Government of India has released ₹ 27,359.60 crore under SCM, out of which ₹ 22,467.81 crore (82%) has already been utilized. As on 12 November 2021, 6,452 projects worth ₹ 1,84,998 crore (90% of total projects) have been tendered; out of which 5,809 projects worth ₹ 1,56,571 crore (85%) implementation/completed. The period implementation of SCM has been extended upto June 2023 and all Smart Cities are expected to complete their projects within the stipulated time.
