NATIONAL CYCLONE RISK MITIGATION PROJECTS

309. DR. T. SUMATHY (a) THAMIZHACHI THANGAPANDIAN:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has left out Tamil Nadu State from National Cyclone Risk Mitigation Projects (NCRMP) Phase-I & II which were implemented to respond better to cyclones and for the construction of infrastructure to address the vulnerability of coastal community to cyclones
- (b) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (c) the effective measures taken by the Government to implement projects under NCRMP in Tamil Nadu; and
- (d) the details of the funds allocated for the projects under NCRMP?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI NITYANAND RAI)

- (a) to (c): National Cyclone Risk Mitigation Project (NCRMP) is a World Bank assisted centrally sponsored scheme, being implemented in the 8 coastal States, in two phases. Two States were covered in Phase-I, namely, Andhra Pradesh and Odisha; and six States are covered in Phase-II, namely Goa, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra and West Bengal. The project has the following four components:
 - Component A: Early Warning Dissemination System (EWDS), the state of the art multi-technology option (Alert Siren, Satellite Radio, Mass Messaging, etc.), to provide reliable communication and ensuring last mile connectivity during disaster.

- ii. Component B: Cyclone Risk Mitigation Infrastructure (CRMI), to enhance the preparedness and mitigate the vulnerability of the coastal communities through investments for construction of multi-purpose cyclone shelters (MPCS), roads, bridges and saline embankments.
- iii. Component C: Technical Assistance for Capacity Building on multi hazard risk management.
- iv. Component D: Project Management and Monitoring.

At the time of the inception of NCRMP, as Tamil Nadu State was already implementing a similar World Bank assisted project *viz.* "Coastal Disaster Risk Reduction Project" with a total outlay of Rs. 1481.80 crore, having similar components, it was not made part of NCRMP.

(d):Revised fund allocation under NCRMP Phase-I and NCRMP Phase-II are Rs. 2541.60 crore and Rs. 2059.83 crore, respectively.
