NEW INDUSTRY COMPLEX

3100. DR. AMAR SINGH:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:-

- (a) whether the Government is looking for avenues to further revitalise the economy of Punjab by establishing a new industrial complex in Mandi Gobindgarh, also known as the Loha Mandi and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the details of existing projects, if any, for establishing an industrial complex in or around the Fatehgarh Sahib constituency of Punjab during the last three years,
- (c) whether the Government recognizes the geographical advantage of Mandi Gobindgarh for a state-of-the-art industrial complex and if so, the details of the provisions, if any, which the Government plans to introduce in order to modernise it; and
- (d) the details of the trends of economic activities, as recorded in a survey, if any, taking place in the constituency of Fatehgarh Sahib, Punjab?

ANSWER

(a) to (c): Ministry of MSME implements Micro and Small Enterprises-Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP). The objective of the scheme is to enhance the productivity and competitiveness of Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) by extending financial assistance for establishment of Common Facility Centers (CFCs) and establishment/up-gradation of Industrial Areas/Estates/Flatted Factory Complex. The scheme is demand driven and State Government may make a request for approval a project as per the industrial development needs. One project for up-gradation of existing Industrial Estate at Focal Point, Mandi Gobindgarh, Fatehgarh Sahib, Punjab was approved during the financial year 2018-19 at a Total project cost of Rs. 247.81lakh with GoI grant of Rs. 198.24 lakh under the scheme.

(d): To give impetus to economic activities in Fatehgarh Sahib, Punjab, during 2018-19 to 2021-22 (till 01.12.2021) 194 micro enterprises have been set under Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) and margin money disbursed to these enterprises was Rs. 306 lakh. MSMEs of the region may also avail benefits under other schemes and programmes of the Ministry of MSME such as Credit Guarantee Fund Trust for Micro and Small Enterprises (CGTMSE), Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI), A Scheme for Promoting Innovation, Rural Industry & Entrepreneurship (ASPIRE), Rs. 20,000 crore Subordinate Debt for MSMEs, Rs. 3 lakh crores Collateral free Automatic Loans for business, including MSMEs, Rs. 50,000 crore equity infusion through MSME Fund of Funds, International Cooperation Scheme (IC) and Procurement and Marketing Support Scheme (P&MS) etc.
