Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of school students in the country who do not have access to any form of online learning or e-learning State and UT-wise break-up;
- (b) the measures taken to ensure seamless continuation of learning for students who lack such access;
- (c) the details of measures taken to equip teachers with appropriate resources to continue conducting classes during the Covid-19 pandemic; and
- (d) the frameworks, if any, for the safe reopening of schools and universities and contingency plans for prolonged e-learning in case of extended closure of schools and Universities?

- (b) To facilitate the online learning by all students a comprehensive initiative called PM eVIDYA has been initiated as part of AtmaNirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan on 17th May, 2020, which unifies all efforts related to digital/online/on-air education to enable multimode access to education. The initiative includes:
 - DIKSHA the nation's digital infrastructure for providing quality e-content for school education in states/UTs and QR coded Energized Textbooks for all grades (one nation, one digital platform).

- One earmarked Swayam Prabha TV channel per class from 1 to 12 (one class, one channel).
- Extensive use of Radio, Community radio and CBSE Podcast- Shiksha Vani.
- Special e-content for visually and hearing impaired developed on Digitally Accessible Information System (DAISY) and in sign language on NIOS website/ YouTube.
- (c) An Integrated Teacher Training Programme called NISHTHA has been launched, it is a capacity building programme for "Improving Quality of School Education through Integrated Teacher Training". NISHTHA can be accessed from the below link: https://itpd.ncert.gov.in//
