Poaching Incidents

3567. SHRI CHANDRA PRAKASH CHOUDHARY:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of tigers killed by poachers in Bandhavgarh Forest area of Madhya Pradesh during the last three years;
- (b) whether an Inter-State racket of poaching of wild animals in Bandhavgarh forest was busted by the State Government of Madhya Pradesh recently and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the said poaching racket was operating from other States and involved residents of the Wildlife Sanctuary, for poaching of tigers in Madhya Pradesh and if so, the details thereof;
- (d) whether the Government is aware that such rackets are also involved in poaching of wild animals in other States, if so, the reaction of the Government thereto; and
- (e) whether the Government is considering to conduct any high level inquiry in this regard and if so, the details thereof?
