FAKE INFORMATION ON WEBSITES

Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state;

(a) whether various websites and videos provide fake information regarding various Government Schemes; and

(b) if so, the details thereof and if not, the actions taken by the Government to curb such websites and videos?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING; AND MINISTER OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS

(SHRI ANURAG SINGH THAKUR):

(a) to (b):- The Government has notified Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021 under Information Technology Act, 2000, on 25th February, 2021.Part-III of these Rules inter- alia provide for Code of Ethics to be followed by publishers of news & current affairs, which include adherence to the Programme Code laid down under Cable Television Networks Act, 1995 and Norms of Journalistic Conduct laid down under Press Council Act, 1978, alongwith a three level grievance redressal mechanism for adherence to the Code of Ethics. The Programme Code and Norms of Journalistic Conduct inter-alia require the publishers not to disseminate content which is inaccurate, misleading, false halftruths, etc.

A Fact Check Unit (FCU) has also been set up in November, 2019 under Press Information Bureau of this Ministry. This unit takes cognizance of fake news both suo-motu and by way of queries sent by citizens on its portal or through e-mail and WhatsApp and responds to the relevant queries with correct information pertaining to the Central Government. The Unit also maintains a twitter account @PIBFactcheck and posts cases of fake news, being busted, on the same on regular basis. PIB Fact Check Unit has responded to 29,079 actionable queries.
