Will the Minister of FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING मत्स्यपालन, पशुपालन और डेयरी मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is huge potential in livestock and dairying sector and a large number of people are employed in the said sectors in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State-wise;
- (c) the details of the animal husbandry and dairying related schemes implemented by the Government to expand the respective sectors across the country including coastal States like the State of Kerala; and
- (d) the various steps taken by the Government to increase the employment opportunities in these sectors and to protect indigenous species?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING (SHRI PARSHOTTAM RUPALA)

- (a) to (c) Yes Sir. The Government is implementing various schemes to supplement the efforts of the States/UTs across the country including coastal states like the state of Kerala which helps to increase the employment opportunities in the field of animal husbandry and dairying directly as well as indirectly such as:
 - i. Rashtriya Gokul Mission,
 - ii. National Programme for Dairy Development,
 - iii. Dairy Processing and Infrastructure Development Fund,
 - iv. Supporting Dairy Cooperatives and Farmer Producer Organizations engaged in dairy activities
 - v. National Livestock Mission,
 - vi. Livestock Health and Disease Control
 - vii. Animal Husbandry Infrastructure Development Fund
 - viii. National Animal Disease Control Programme

(d) The Government is implementing various animal husbandry and dairying schemes to enhance production and productivity of fish, bovines & small ruminants (sheep & goat), piggery & poultry. This helps in creating entrepreneurship, direct & indirect employment and better livelihood opportunities for unemployed youth and farmers in cattle, dairy, poultry, sheep, goat, piggery, feed and fodder sector.

Rashtriya Gokul Mission has been implemented for development and conservation of indigenous bovine breeds since December 2014. The scheme is crucial for upliftment of rural poor as more than 80% low producing indigenous animals are with small and marginal farmers and landless labours. The scheme is important in enhancing milk production and productivity of bovines to meet growing demand of milk and making dairying more remunerative to the rural farmers of the country. The scheme is leading to multiplication of elite animals of indigenous breeds and increased availability of indigenous stock.
