- (b) the details of the present status of tap water supply in rural areas of Madhya Pradesh including Bhind district, district-wise;
- (c) the total number of households provided with tap water connection since the launch of the mission till date in Madhya Pradesh including Bhind district; district-wise; and
- (d) the number of schools and anganwadi centres having access to piped water supply in Madhya Pradesh including Bhind district, district-wise?

(b) to (d) In Madhya Pradesh, since launch of Jal Jeevan Mission, more than 30.53 lakh rural households (25%) have been provided tap water connections. Thus, as on 29.11.2021, provisions of tap water supply have been made available to 44.06 lakh (36%) rural households in the State. Further, as on 29.11.2021, in 66,938 (72%) schools and 39,370 (59%) anganwadi centres, provision of tap water supply has been made in the State. The details are **annexed.**
