**Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:**

- (a) whether the Government has recently organized an online event where it announced eleven winning cities for the 'streets for people challenge' and ten winning cities for the pilot stage of the 'nurturing neighbourhoods challenge';**
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the criteria fixed by the Government for choosing such cities;**
- (c) whether the Government proposes to provide any financial assistance to cities which performed better in 'streets for people challenge' and if so, the details thereof;**
- (d) whether the Government proposes to actively engage local population of the cities selected for the 'streets for people challenge' by spreading awareness and encouraging them to transform their traffic centric streets into people-centric streets and if so, the details thereof; and**
- (e) whether the Government proposes to include more cities, in addition to present hundred cities under 'streets for people challenge' and if so, the details thereof?**

**STATEMENT**

**STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY OF PARTS (a) to (e) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. \*131 (11<sup>TH</sup> POSITION) FOR ANSWER ON 10.02.2022 REGARDING NURTURING NEIGHBOURHOODS CHALLENGE IN CITIES.**

**(a) to (e) Yes, Sir. An online event was held by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) on 17 January 2022 to announce 11 winning cities for the Streets for People Challenge and 10 winning cities for the pilot stage of the Nurturing Neighbourhoods Challenge.**

**Under the Streets for People challenge, participating cities undertook pilot projects on redesigning streets, citizen surveys and conducted capacity building workshops. The Challenge was conducted in two phases. 38 cities submitted their proposals in Phase-1 of the Challenge in July 2021. Of these, 30 cities were shortlisted and evaluated to finally identify 11 winners for Phase-1. Stage-wise submissions from cities were reviewed based on the quality of pilot interventions, participatory processes, quality of city-level scale-up plans and innovative strategies for funding the implementation of long-term measures.**

**Under the Nurturing Neighborhoods Challenge, a jury including both national and international technical experts was constituted to evaluate pilot projects proposed and implemented by participating cities in Phase-I of the Challenge. Projects were evaluated based on assessment of outcomes on ground, quality of design and implementation, and the processes adopted for city-level change. Details of winning cities under both the challenges is at Annexure-I.**

**Each of the 11 winning cities of the Streets for People Challenge will receive Rs. 50 lakhs to scale up their initiatives in Stage 2 of the Streets4People Challenge.**

**As part of the Streets for People Challenge, there is a strong emphasis on community-led action and hence, cities have proactively engaged with approximately 1.5 lakh citizens through tactical urbanism methods.**

**Season-2 of the Streets for People Challenge has been launched. All Smart Cities, all cities with over 5 lakh population, all State/UT Capital cities and all cities with Municipal Corporations will be eligible for Season-2 of the Challenge.**
