*156. SHRI P.V. MIDHUN REDDY:

Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) the number of seats for Post Graduate(PG) medical courses which remained vacant in the last academic year, speciality-wise;

(b) the steps taken by the Government to ensure that PG medical seats are not left vacant in the future;

(c) whether the Government is planning to increase the number of medical seats for Post Graduate courses considering the shortage of specialized doctors;

(d) if so, the details thereof; and

(e) if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR MANSUKH MANDAVIYA)

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 156* FOR 11TH FEBRUARY, 2022

(a) & (b) As informed by National Medical Commission (NMC), a total of 1,425 Postgraduate seats remained vacant in the last academic year 2020-21 which includes 1365 broad-specialty seats and 60 diploma seats. Specialty wise details are at Annexure-I.

Further, as per the provisions of the Regulations on Graduate Medical Education and Post Graduate Medical Education, the Common Counseling for admission to Central Medical Educational Institutions, All India Quota seats in Government Medical Colleges and Deemed Universities is conducted by Medical Council Committee (MCC), Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India. Similarly, for admission to the State Quota seats in Government Medical College and all the seats in private medical Colleges, the respective State Governments conduct common counseling and are responsible for filling up the seats. The following steps are taken to ensure that PG medical seats are not left vacant:-

- (i) Reduction in the benchmark percentile for admission in P. G. degree & diploma courses.
- (ii) The counseling for all India quota PG (Broad Specialty) seats has been increased to four rounds from the year 2021.

(c) to (e): The Government has taken following steps to further increase the availability of medical Post Graduate seats in the country: -

- i. Centrally Sponsored Scheme for strengthening/ upgradation of existing State Government/Central Government Medical Colleges to increase PG seats.
- ii. Central Sector Scheme for upgradation of Government Medical Colleges by construction of Super Specialty Blocks. A total of 75 projects have been approved and 55 have been completed.
- iii. Under Central Sector Scheme for setting up of new AIIMS, 22 AIIMS have been approved. Undergraduate courses have started in 19 AIIMS.
- iv. DNB qualification has been recognized for appointment as faculty to take care of shortage of faculty.
- v. DNB diploma courses have been approved in 8 broad specialities.
- vi. The ratio of teachers to students has been rationalized to increase the number of postgraduate medical seats in the country.
- vii. By amending the regulations, it has been made mandatory for all medical colleges to start PG courses within 3 years from the date of their MBBS recognition /continuation of recognition.
