Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government proposes to establish new Government Medical Colleges in Jharkhand;

(b) if so, the details thereof, district-wise;

(c) whether the Government has noted that the absence of a Government Medical College in districts with limited medical facilities affects the health of the people as well as the education of medical aspirants; and

(d) if so, the details of the steps being taken by the Government to address the inadequacy of medical facilities in such districts?

ANSWER

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 430* FOR 1ST APRIL, 2022

(a) to (d): The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare administers a Centrally Sponsored Scheme for "Establishment of new medical colleges attached with existing district/referral hospitals" to provide financial support to the States / UTs for establishment of medical college by upgrading the district hospitals in districts which do not have either a government or a private medical college. Fund sharing between the Central Government and States is in the ratio of 90:10 for NE/special category States and 60:40 for other States.

In three Phases of the said Scheme, a total of 5 new medical colleges in Jharkhand have been sanctioned at Dumka, Hazaribagh and Palamu [Phase-I] and Koderma and Chaibasa (Singhbhum) [Phase-II]. Medical Colleges at Dumka, Hazaribagh and Palamu have become functional so far.
