Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government is considering setting up a National Investigation Agency (NIA) Permanent House in Bengaluru;

(b) if so, the details thereof and the reasons for the establishment of the NIA Permanent House;

(c) the details of the resources and funds that will be made available for the setting up of the NIA Permanent House in Bengaluru; and

(d) the total number of NIA Permanent Houses in the country and the cities they are located in?

ANSWER

(a) to (d): In pursuance of the policy of "Zero Tolerance" towards terrorism,

Central Government has strengthened the institutional framework and enhanced

capacity of concerned agencies which include provision of adequate funds.

The Central Government, on 5th January, 2022, sanctioned 6 new branch offices,

including at Bengaluru for the National Investigation Agency (NIA). 52 posts have

been sanctioned for its newly created branch office at Bengaluru.

With the sanction of 6 more branches, the NIA, with headquarters at New Delhi,

has 18 branch offices at Hyderabad, Guwahati, Imphal, Kochi, Chennai, Lucknow,

Kolkata, Jammu, Raipur, Chandigarh, Ranchi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Bhopal, Patna,

Ahmedabad, Jaipur and Bhubaneswar.
