1536. SHRIMATI MANEKA SANJAY GANDHI:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) the status of providing access to water for every household in Bundelkhand region;
- (b) the funds sanctioned for Bundelkhand region, Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh separately during the period from 2015 to 2021;
- (c) the funds utilised by Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh during the said period; and
- (d) whether the Government has conducted an impact assessment of the implemented projects and if so, the details thereof?

(a) As reported by the State of Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh, as on 7.2.2022, the details of access to water in Bundelkhand region, are as under:

Since August 2019, to make provision of potable tap water supply to every rural household of the country by 2024, the Government of India in partnership with States is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM). District wise status of households with the provision of tap water supply in Bundelkhand region is as under:

(b) & (c) Upto 2019, the funds were released to States under National Rural Drinking Water Programme (NRDWP) for making provision of potable and adequate water supply to rural areas. However, after the launch of JJM in August, 2019, the NRDWP got subsumed and specific focus has been provided for the provision of tap water supply to every rural household.

The funds under erstwhile NRDWP and now under JJM, are released State-wise. The district-wise details of fund allocation/ sanctioned is not done by this department. The details of funds drawn and utilized by States of UP & MP, from 2015 to 2021, are at **Annex**.

(d) Under JJM, this department has not conducted any impact assessment study, so far.
