GREEN PORT INITIATIVE

1658. SHRI PINAKI MISRA :

Will the Minister of PORTS, SHIPPING AND WATERWAYS be pleased to state :
पत्तन, पोत परिवहन और जलमार्ग मंत्री

- (a) whether the Paradip Port has a comprehensive solid waste management plant, if so, the percent of total waste being managed including the total energy produced against the total requirement;
- (b) whether the entire power requirements at Paradip Port is met through green energy, if not, the percent of total power requirements generated from renewable energy sources, source-wise; and
- (c) the expected timeline by which Paradip Port will be a Green Port including the steps taken under the Green Port Initiative at Paradip Port so far?

ANSWER

- (a) No, Sir. All solid waste is being managed either by Paradip Municipality or through internal resources. There is no energy being produced from waste.
- (b) No, Sir. 2.2 % of total power requirements is generated through Solar Power.
- (c) Roof-Top Solar Plants for about 450 KWP capacity are installed in the Port area. No land is available for ground-mounted Solar Power Plant.
