#### MISSING CHILDREN

### 1719. SHRI JUAL ORAM:

Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state

- whether the Government has taken note of instances of missing children being recovered by the police although their relatives have not been traced during the last three years:
- (b) if so, the number of such children recovered during the last three years, Statewise; and
- (c) the proposal formulated by the Government regarding the upbringing and education of such children?

#### **ANSWER**

## MINISTER OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI)

- (a) to (b) As informed by the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), it does not maintain data in this regard. Further it is stated that Ministry of Women and Child Development have initiated the "TrackChild Portal", which enables tracking of the missing and found children. Under this, logins have provided to the Police Stations, Juvenile Justice Boards and Child Care Institutions whereby they are required to update the information, on the portal, about missing and found children regularly. State/UT-wise number of children recovered by the police during last three years period (01.01.2019 to 31.12.2021) is at **Annexure-I**.
- (c) The Ministry is implementing a centrally sponsored scheme namely Child Protection Services (CPS) Scheme under which support is provided to States and UT Governments for delivering services for children in need and difficult circumstances. The Child Care Institutions (CCIs) established under the CPS scheme support inter-alia age-appropriate education, access to vocational training, recreation, health care, counselling etc. and covers both rural and urban children.

Besides Samagra Shiksha, effective from 2018-19 is also being implemented for universalization of quality education for all children in coordination with the States and UTs governments.
