TYPES OF TRIBES

†2053. SHRI GUMAN SINGH DAMOR:

Will the Minister of TRIBAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the various types of tribes in the country, State/Union Territories-wise;
- (b) whether the Government has taken any concrete steps for the preservation of the various customs, culture and traditions of these tribes and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the role of the Government in implementation of new education policy in the tribal areas; and
- (d) whether there is any scheme to keep the local languages as the medium of education in the tribal areas and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR TRIBAL AFFAIRS

(a): State/Union Territory wise details of Scheduled Tribes (STs) notified in the Country under Article 342 of the Constitution of India are given at **Annexure**.

(b): Ministry of Tribal Affairs is implementing two schemes namely “Support to Tribal Research Institutes (TRIs)” and “Tribal Festival, Research, Information and Mass Education”. Funds are provided by the Ministry to strengthen and support the TRIs in their infrastructure needs, research & documentation activities, evidence based action and applied research to find solution and create replicate models of development, construction and maintenance of tribal museums, organization of tribal festivals, programs for promotion of tribal custom, traditions and cultural heritage in dance, music, painting etc. and training and capacity building programs.

Further, through the scheme ‘Tribal Festival, Research Information and Mass Education’, promotion of rich tribal cultural heritage, dissemination of information and creation of awareness are given attention to which includes organization of tribal craft & food festivals, sports, music, dance & photo competitions, science, art & craft Expos, workshops, seminars, production of documentary films by the Ministry & States, bringing out publications thereby highlighting significant studies, documenting historical facets of tribal communities, achievements of Ministry of Tribal Affairs (MoTA) & State departments, etc. With a view to fill the gap of research studies on tribal issues, MoTA recognizes renowned Non Government Organisations (NGOs), Research Institutes, Universities where expertise exist and which have already made a mark by carrying out pioneering research in the field of tribal cultures as Centre of Excellences (CoEs). It is envisaged that CoEs should play an important role in building knowledge bank to complement dedicated institutions i.e., Tribal Research Institutes in the States for devising appropriate strategies for tribal development by the Government.

(c): New Education Policy, 2020 (NEP 2020) aims to ensure that no child loses any opportunity to learn and excel because of the circumstances of birth or background. It proposes special emphasis to be given on Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Groups (SEDGs) which include gender identities (particularly female and transgender individuals), socio-cultural identities (such as scheduled castes, scheduled tribes, other backward classes and minorities), geographical identities (such as students from villages, small towns, and aspirational districts), disabilities (including learning disabilities) and socio-economic conditions.

Implementation of the Policy requires multiple initiatives and actions, which will have to be taken by different bodies in a synchronized and systematic manner. Therefore, the implementation of this Policy is led by various bodies including Union and State Governments, education-related Ministries, State Departments of Education, Boards, National Testing Agency (NTA), the regulatory bodies of school and higher education, National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT), State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERTs), Schools and Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). Since education is a concurrent subject, it will need careful planning, joint monitoring, and collaborative implementation between the Centre and States.

(d): Section 29 (2) (f) of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009 states that “medium of instruction shall, as far as practicable, be in child’s mother tongue”.

NEP 2020 inter-alia states that one of the fundamental principles of National Education Policy-2020 is ‘promoting multilingualism and the power of language in teaching and learning’. NEP 2020 states that wherever possible, the medium of instruction until at least Grade 5, but preferably till Grade 8 and beyond, will be the home language/mother tongue/local language/regional language. Thereafter, the home/local language shall continue to be taught as a language wherever possible. It further recommends for use of mother tongue/local language as a medium of instruction, and/or offer programmes bilingually in the higher education system.

One of the major features of the scheme “Samagra Shiksha” of Ministry of Education, for improving the access, infrastructure and quality of education throughout the country is provision of free textbooks to all children and free uniforms to all girls, SC, ST and BPL boys at elementary level including primers/textbooks for tribal languages with bridging materials.

Further, Ministry of Tribal Affairs extends support to State Governments / UTs for mother tongue-based education and development of bilingual Primers for enhancement of learning achievement level amongst the Scheduled Tribe Students.
