Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has formulated any plan for urban development;**
- (b) if so, the details thereof;**
- (c) the number of proposals received from the Government of Madhya Pradesh for urban development along with the details thereof, district-wise;**
- (d) whether municipal bodies of Siwani Balaghat district falling within Balaghat Parliamentary Constituency have been included in this scheme;**
- (e) if so, the proposals of municipal bodies of Siwani Balaghat district included therein; and**
- (f) the details of work proposed to be undertaken therein?**

ANSWER

- (a) to (f) Urban Development is a State subject. The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs assists the States/Union Territories (UTs) including Madhya Pradesh in development of urban infrastructure through its Missions- Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation 2.0 (AMRUT 2.0), Smart Cities Mission, Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban 2.0 (SBM-U 2.0), Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Urban (PMAY-U) and Scheme for Urban Transport. The progress of proposals in respect of the Missions for the state of Madhya Pradesh, including Municipal bodies of Siwani, Balaghat district is Annexed.**

Annexure referred to in reply to parts (a) to (f) of Lok Sabha Unstarred Question No 2632 regarding 'Proposal for Urban Development' for answer on 17 March, 2022.

1. Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation(AMRUT)

Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) was launched by the Government on 25 June 2015 in 500 selected cities across the country. The Mission focuses on the development of basic urban infrastructure in the sectors of water supply; sewerage and septage management; storm water drainage; non-motorised urban transport and development of green spaces and parks.

A total of 34 cities from the State of Madhya Pradesh have been selected under AMRUT.

The approved plan size under AMRUT of the State of Madhya Pradesh for the entire Mission period is ₹6,200.67 crore, which includes committed Central Assistance of ₹2,592.86 crore. Against the approved plan size, State of Madhya Pradesh has taken 211 projects worth ₹6,470 crore under AMRUT, of which 161 projects worth ₹2,927 crore have been completed and remaining are in progress. So far, an amount of ₹2,497.05 crore have been released for AMRUT projects.

Government of India launched AMRUT 2.0 scheme on 1 October, 2021 for the period of 05 years i.e. from the financial year 2021-22 to the financial year 2025-26. AMRUT 2.0 is designed to provide universal coverage of water supply through functional taps to all households in all the statutory towns in the country and coverage of sewerage / septage management in 500 cities covered in first phase of the AMRUT scheme. Plan of States/ Union Territories (UTs) under AMRUT 2.0 are yet to be approved.

Seoni city of Seoni District of Madhya Pradesh is covered under AMRUT scheme. However, Govt. of Madhya Pradesh has not taken any project under AMRUT in this city. No city of Balaghat District has been covered under AMRUT.

2. Smart Cities Mission (SCM)

Government of India launched the Smart Cities Mission (SCM) on 25 June 2015 for development of 100 cities as Smart Cities. The selection of 100 Smart Cities has been completed through 4 rounds of selection from January, 2016 to June, 2018.

As per SCM Statement & Guidelines, Central Government will provide financial support to the Mission to the extent of ₹ 48,000 crore over five years i.e. on an average ₹ 100 crore per city per year. An equal amount on a matching basis will be contributed by the State Government/Urban Local Body.

As on 4 March 2022, these Smart Cities have tendered out 6,928 projects worth ₹ 1,91,238 crore; work orders have been issued in 6,282 projects worth ₹ 1,65,503 crore; 3,576 projects worth ₹ 59,958 crore have been completed. As on 4 March 2022, Government of India has released ₹ 29,213.60 crore for 100 Smart Cities, out of which ₹ 25,177.65 crore (86%) has been utilized.

In the State of Madhya Pradesh, 7 cities i.e. Bhopal, Gwalior, Indore, Jabalpur, Sagar, Satna & Ujjain have been selected for development as Smart Cities. The present status of Smart City projects in Madhya Pradesh, funds released by Central Government and utilization thereof is given below:

3. Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban (SBM-U)

SBM-U is concerned with construction of Toilets (Individual House Hold Latrines, Community/ Public Toilets/ Urinals) and scientific Management of Solid Waste in all notified ULBs and for Used Water Management in ULBs with population less than one lakh. Under SBM-U 2.0 lauched on October 1,

2021, ₹1,41,600 crore have been allocated for the entire Mission period up to October 1, 2026. No proposal has been received district-wise from Govt of Madhya Pradesh. However, ULB wise proposal for bio-remediation of legacy waste dumpsites has been received for Bhind, Shivpuri, Damoh, Madideep, Betul, Hosangabad, Seoni and Ashok Nagar. No Municipal Body of Siwani Balaghat District falling within Balaghat Parliamentary Constituency have been included in the proposal.

Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Urban (PMAY-U)

Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs under the vision of 'Housing for All' by 2022 is supplementing the efforts of States/Union territories (UTs) by providing Central Assistance under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Urban (PMAY-U) for construction of houses for all eligible families/beneficiaries since 25.06.2015.
