(a) whether the agriculture sector is facing serious challenges due to the lack of productivity of many crops resulting from inadequate infrastructural development and institutional changes; and

(a) & (b): The productivity of field crops especially foodgrains have increased during the last ten years from 2079 kg/ha in 2011-12 to 2411 kg/ha in 2021-22 (2^{nd} Advance Estimates).

The Government of India provides support to the States for creation/strengthening of agricultural infrastructure under various schemes viz., Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY), Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojna (RKVY), PM Formalisation of Micro food processing Enterprises Scheme (PM FME Scheme), Agriculture Infrastructure Fund (AIF), Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH), Agri-Market Infrastructure Fund (AMIF), National Agriculture Market (eNAM), Promotion of 10,000 Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), National Food Security Mission, schemes of Ministry of fisheries animal husbandry and dairying, Research and Development infrastructure of ICAR, besides other agricultural development programmes of the central and state governments. The increasing investment in agriculture sector is a major catalyst in improving productivity of agriculture and allied sectors.
