DEVELOPMENT OF J&K

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the situation in Jammu & Kashmir (J&K) is still not normal;
- (b) if so, the steps being taken by the Government in this regard; and
- (c) the efforts being made by the Government for the all round development of J&K?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI NITYANAND RAI)

(a) & (b): The Government has instituted a robust security and intelligence grid along with proactive operations against terrorists.

Therefore, the security situation in Jammu and Kashmir has improved substantially and there has been a significant decline in terrorist incidents and infiltration of terrorists from across the border. The details are as below:

- (c): The Government has taken several steps to boost development of Jammu & Kashmir. Some of these measures are:
 - i) The progress of projects being implemented in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir under the Prime Minister's Development Package-2015 has been accelerated. 53 projects pertaining to 15 Ministries are being implemented at a cost of Rs. 58,477 crores, in various sectors such as Roads, Power, Health, Education, Tourism, Agriculture, Skill Development etc., out of which 25 projects have been completed/substantially completed.
 - ii) A New Central Sector Scheme has been notified on 19/02/2021 for the Industrial Development of Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir, with an outlay of Rs. 28,400 crores, which is likely to provide employment to over 4.5 lakh people while boosting the industrial development of J&K.
 - iii) The Government of Jammu and Kashmir has approved business revival package of Rs. 1,352.99 Crores on 25th September, 2020.
 - iv) Under languishing projects programme, 1193 projects worth Rs.1984 crores were completed, including 5 projects which were incomplete

for more than 20 years, 15 projects for more than 15 years and 165 projects for more than 10 years.

- v) J&K has been declared Open Defecation Free (ODF) under Swachh Bharat Mission.
- vi) 100 % saturation has been achieved in 17 Individual beneficiary centric schemes, including Saubhagya, Ujala, Ujjwala and Indradhanush schemes.
- vii) During the year 2020-21, 1289 road construction works were completed at a cost of Rs.1638 crore. The construction work of 14500 km of road has been completed so far under Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojna, which has connected about 2000 places.
- viii) Work has been taken up for setting up of one All India Institute of Medical Sciences each in Jammu and Kashmir Divisions at a cost of Rs. 2000 crores each, besides 7 other medical colleges in the UT of J&K.
- ix)Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Jammu and Indian Institute of

 Management (IIM) Jammu have been made functional.

- x) 21 hydro power projects with aggregate capacity of 5186 MW have been taken up for development in next 05 years.
- xi) International flight from Srinagar to Sharjah has been started on 23.10.2021. In addition, night flights from Jammu and Srinagar have also been started.
- xii) The scope of High Density Plantation Scheme for Apple has been expanded to include Mango, Litchi, Cherry, Walnut etc.

 Kashmiri Saffron has been given the Geographical Indication(GI) tag.
- xiii) Under fast-track recruitment, 26330 posts have been identified in various departments in the UT of J&K and taken up for recruitment. Presently selection process has been completed with respect to 11,324 posts.
