PRODUCTION FROM DISCONTINUED MINES

3424. SHRI GAURAV GOGOI:

Will the Minister of **COAL** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has announced that 100 shut or production discontinued mines of Coal India will be operated in partnership with private companies;
- (b) if so, whether a consultation meeting with private sector has been held in this regard and if so, the details of participants;
- (c) the terms of revenue-sharing envisioned for such partnership;
- (d) the reasons for shutting or discontinuing production in these 100 mines;
- (e) whether such a step is counter-productive to the 7 February, 2022 statement of the Government with respect to eco-friendly use of abandoned coal mines;
- (f) the impact of the decision to use de-coaled areas for extensive plantation, development of eco/mine tourism parks, agricultural fields, orchards, creating water bodies to augment ground water recharge and drinking water supply, etc.; and
- (g) the effects of reopening of 100 mines on India's coal phase down pledges made in COP26?

ANSWER

- (a): Government has tentatively identified as of now 13 discontinued mines of Coal India Limited to be operated in partnership with private companies.
- (b): Consultations with stakeholders of private sector for preparation of model document for tendering of these discontinued mines was held on 24.02.2022 at New Delhi and on 11.03.2022 at CMPDI (HQ), Ranchi. The following participants have attended the meeting:-

- (d): The reasons for shutting or discontinuing production was as follows:-
- 1. Viability issues / unprofitable operation of mines
- 2. Difficult geo-mining conditions
- 3. Lack of suitable technology to extract deeper resources, etc.
- (e): No, Sir.
- (f): After extraction of coal from these mines, de-coaled areas of these mines will also be used for extensive plantation, development of eco/mine tourism parks, agricultural fields, orchards, creating water bodies to augment ground water recharge and drinking water supply, etc.

(g): The above decision to operate some discontinued mines in partnership with private companies, has been taken to meet the high demand of coal. It is not likely to affect India's coal phase down pledges made in COP26.
