SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLANT AT PARADIP PORT

3869. SHRIMATI RAJASHREE MALLICK:

Will the Minister of PORTS, SHIPPING AND WATERWAYS be pleased to state :

- (a) whether the Paradip Port has a comprehensive solid waste management plant and if so, the percentage of total waste being managed including the total energy produced against the total requirement;
- (b) whether the entire power requirement at Paradip port is met through green energy, if so, the percent of total power requirement generated from renewable energy sources, source-wise;
- (c) the expected timeline by which Paradip port is likely to be a green port; and
- (d) the steps taken under the Green Port Initiative at Paradip Port so far?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF PORTS, SHIPPING AND WATERWAYS (SHRI SARBANANDA SONOWAL)

- (a) No, Sir. All solid waste is being managed either by Paradip Municipality or through internal resources. There is no energy being produced from waste.
- (b) No, Sir. 2.2 % of total power requirements is generated through Solar Power.
- (c) & (d) Roof-Top Solar Plants for about 450 KWP capacity are installed in the Port area. No land is available for ground-mounted Solar Power Plant.
