# NATIONAL BROADBAND MISSION

### 41. SHRI MARGANI BHARAT:

Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is true that the National Broadband Mission aims to provide 10 Mbps broadband speed at the end of this fiscal i.e., 2021-22;

(b) if so, whether the Government is in line to achieve this target;

(c) whether it is true that broadband speed of 4 Mbps target in 2020-21 has not been achieved so far;

(d) If so, the manner in which the Government is planning to achieve 10 Mbps at the end of 2021-22;

(e) whether it is also true that a target of 25 Mbps by 2022-23, 30 Mbps by 2023-24 and 50 Mbps by 2024- 25 is planned to be achieved; and

(f) if so, the details of the plan of action that the Government has to achieve in this regard?

#### ANSWER

# MINISTER OF STATE FOR COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI DEVUSINH CHAUHAN)

(a) Yes, it is true.

(b) to (d) As per Ookla speed test global index March 2021 report (<u>https://www.speedtest.net/global-index/india</u>), India was experiencing Median download speeds of 8.19 Mbps in case of mobile broadband and around 38.85 Mbps in case of fixed broadband. As per December 2021 report (<u>https://www.speedtest.net/global-index/india</u>), India is experiencing Median download speeds of 14.17 Mbps in case of mobile broadband and around 47.48 Mbps in case of fixed broadband.

- (e) Yes, it is true.
- (f) Plan of action under the Mission include:
- i. All villages to have access to broadband;
- ii. Accelerate Fiberization;
- iii. Increasing tower density;
- iv. Increase fiberization of telecom towers;
- v. Easing of Right of Way (RoW) permissions in coordination with State/UTs & other central ministries.
