- (a) whether NITI Aayog has recommended redevelopment of 400 stations in the country including Telangana and Andhra Pradesh;**
- (b) if so, the details of stations identified for redevelopment, State/district-wise;**
- (c) the details of blueprint prepared for redevelopment of identified stations in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh along with the progress made so far in this regard;**
- (d) the estimated revenue that the Railways is likely to generate from such redevelopment particularly from Telangana and Andhra Pradesh;**
- (e) whether the Railways is likely to utilize the revenue so generated from redevelopment in the States itself and if not, the reasons therefor; and**
- (f) whether the Ministry is planning to redevelop more stations and if so, the details thereof ?**

RANJITH REDDY TO BE ANSWERED IN LOK SABHA ON 30.03.2022 REGARDING REDEVELOPMENT OF STATIONS IN TELANGANA/ANDHRA PRADESH

(a) to (f): Ministry of Railways through various agencies is undertaking techno-economic feasibility studies of Railway stations. Based on the outcome of these feasibility studies, stations are planned to be taken up for development in phases, especially the stations located in major cities and important tourist destinations.

Recently 41 stations have been identified for major upgradation of Railway Stations including Tirupati and Nellore stations in the state of Andhra Pradesh and Secunderabad station in the state of Telangana.

Station development programme is first of its kind and complex in nature, as such, the estimated revenue that the Railway is likely to generate from such development cannot be indicated at this stage.
