(b) to (e): Yes, Sir. The cadets of National Cadet Corps (NCC) are imparted military training to encourage them to join the defence forces. The Government has also set up schools (Sainik School, Military School, RIMC) which impart training with the aim of encouraging and preparing the students to join the defence forces.

The Government has taken a number of measures to reduce the shortages and to encourage recruitments in the armed forces. These, inter-alia, include sustained image projection, participation in career fairs and exhibitions and publicity campaign to create awareness among the youth on the advantages of taking up a challenging and satisfying career in the Armed Forces.

To encourage the youth to join the Armed Forces, motivational lectures are regularly organized in schools/ colleges/other educational institutes and National Cadet Corps (NCC) camps.

Further, the Government has taken various steps to make the service in the Armed Forces attractive including improvement in promotion prospects in the Armed Forces and to fill up vacancies. As per the Government policy on the subject, all citizens irrespective of their caste, creed, region or religion are eligible for enrolment in the Indian Armed Forces.
