#### Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has taken cognizance of the announcement by the G-7 countries for providing one billion doses of vaccines to developing countries;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the reaction of the Government thereto;
- (c) the number of such vaccine doses received from G-7 countries and North Atlantic Treaty organisation (NATO) allies so far, country/month-wise;
- (d) whether the Government is aware of any shortage of vaccination in the country which is likely to hinder the achievement of vaccination for all; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof along with the action taken thereon?

(a) to (e): India is not a member of G-7 countries and India has not received any COVID-19 vaccine doses from G-7 countries and North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) member countries.

India has enough vaccine available in the country to cover all eligible beneficiaries and adequate Covid-19 vaccine doses are made available to all States/UTs to vaccinate all eligible beneficiaries with 1<sup>st</sup> dose, 2<sup>nd</sup> dose and precaution dose.

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
