- (a) the number of All India Services Officers in Andhra Pradesh, service-wise;
- (b) the shortage of All India Services Officers in Andhra Pradesh, service-wise;
- (c) whether the Government is planning to address the shortage of the officers;
- (d) if so, the details thereof including the manner in which the shortage would be filled; and
- (e) if not, the reasons therefor?

- (a): The details of All India Service officers in Andhra Pradesh as on 01.01.2021 are as under:

Service	Officers
IAS	194
IPS	111
IFS	55

(b) & (c): Occurrence and filling up of vacancies is a continuous process. It is the endeavor of Central Government to fill up vacant posts expeditiously. The Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) conducts Examinations for filling up of vacancies on direct recruitment basis in IAS, IPS and IFS every year. To fill up vacancies in Promotion Quota, Selection Committee Meetings are held by Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) with the State Governments.

(d) & (e): The Government has increased the annual intake of IAS officers to 180 through Civil Services Examination (CSE) till CSE-2021. Further, a Committee has been constituted for recommending the intake of Direct Recruit IAS officers every year through CSE from CSE-2022 to CSE-2030. Intake of IPS through CSE has been increased to 200 from CSE-2020. Intake of IFS has been increased to 150 in 2022.
