Student-Faculty Ratio at IIT

788. DR. SHASHI THAROOR:

Will the Minister of **Education** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the number of faculty members employed by Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT) with a breakup of reserved categories and the number of vacancies at each IIT;
- (b) the student to faculty ratio at each IIT;
- (c) whether the Government has taken any steps to address the number of vacancies and reach a more effective student to faculty ratio and if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (d) whether the Government is considering relaxation of reservation requirements in order to fill the vacancies and if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (e) whether the Government has taken measures to increase the pool of candidates who can fulfil the qualification requirements from reserved categories by providing incentives of any sort and if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (DR. SUBHAS SARKAR)

- (a) & (b): The details are at **ANNEXURE**.
- (c) to (e): IITs are autonomous institutes governed by the Institutes of Technology Act, 1961 and the Statutes framed there under from time to time. Filling up of vacancies is a continuous process and IITs issue rolling Advertisement, which is open throughout the year for all candidates, who fulfill the required qualifications and experience for faculty positions in IITs.

Ministry of Education has requested all IITs to fill up the vacancies in faculty cadre through Special Recruitment Drive in Mission Mode. The Ministry has asked IITs to follow the reservation as per Central Education Institutes (Reservation in Teacher's Cadre) Act, 2019. In Ph.D programme, candidates from reserved categories are given relaxation in qualifying marks, application fees during admission process and granted fellowship so as to increase the pool of candidates available for the faculty posts in IITs.
