Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has proposed to establish new Central Institute of Indian Languages;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether the Government has proposed to establish a new regional language centre in Andhra Pradesh; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (DR. SUBHAS SARKAR)

- (a) & (b): No Sir. There is no proposal to establish new Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL). The CIIL was established in 1969 by the Government of India at Mysuru with regional languages centres at Mysuru, Bhubaneswar, Pune, Patiala, Solan, Lucknow, Guwahati. Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL) works for the promotion of all Indian languages including Scheduled/Non-Scheduled and Classical languages.
- (c) & (d) : No Sir. No regional language centre is proposed to be set up at Andhra Pradesh. However, Centre of Excellence for Studies for Classical Telugu has been shifted from Mysuru to Nellore (A.P) for promotion of Classical Telugu Language works under CIIL.
