Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government proposes to formulate any scheme to develop more coordination between schools, higher education and various National Skill Programmes in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of expected amount under this programme;
- (d) the details of objectives to be set under this programme;
- (e) the details and number of States where this scheme is proposed to be implemented;
- (f) whether the Government proposes to cover Rajasthan also under this scheme;
- (g) if so, the details thereof, district-wise; and
- (h) the time by which it is proposed to be implemented?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP (SHRI RAJEEV CHANDRASEKHAR)

- (a) & (b) Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) in Coordination with Ministry of Education has organized Skill network, School network and Higher Education network into Skill Hubs Initiative (SHI) as a pilot project on 01.01.2022 under central component of PMKVY 3.0 which focuses on introduction of skill training programme in education ecosystem as envisioned in National Education Policy (NEP), 2020. However, All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) has initiated Skill India Initiative (SII) to encourage the institutions for making the best use of available infrastructure of higher education system during off hours for skill training by re-aligning the existing infrastructure for the skill courses specially, training aids, syllabus, curriculum etc, as per NSQF aligned Qualifications. Under the initiative there are 3 Models for Skilling of In-school students/school dropouts, students perusing Technical Education:
- Model 1: Targeting School Dropouts after class 10th pass (long back and recent).
- Model 2: Targeting Advance level Skilling of students already studying in AICTE approved Technical institutions.

Model 3: Integrating School Education with Higher Education for skilling students.

- (c), (d) & (e) The estimated outlay of SHI is Rs. 700 crores. SHI is the integration and mainstreaming of vocational education with general education as envisaged under the NEP 2020. Skill Hubs are nodal skill centres identified to provide skill development and vocational training opportunities to drop-outs and out of education candidates. As on 30.06.2022, 1957 SHI have been established across the country.
- (f), (g) & (h) 65 State Hubs Initiatives (SHIs) are in the State of Rajasthan. The last date of enrolment of candidates under the SHI-PMKVY 3.0 was 31.03.2022. The district wise details of SHI and candidates trained in the State of Rajasthan are given at Annexure.
