- (a) the details of implementation of National Programme for Dairy Development (NPDD) Scheme during each of the last five years and the current year;
- (b) the reasons that the Government has not released any amount under NPDD to Telangana during 2020-21; and
- (c) the details of allocation made in 2021-22 and 2022-23 and the extent to which the Government is helping the State to push in milk production and help dairy farmers to get more income?

#### **ANSWER**

# THE MINISTER OF FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING (SHRI PARSHOTTAM RUPALA)

- (a) This Department is implementing Central Sector Scheme- "National Programme for Dairy Development (NPDD)" across the country since Feb-2014. The scheme was restructured/realigned in July 2021. The restructured NPDD Scheme is implemented from 2021-22 to 2025-26, with following two components:
- (i) The Component 'A' of NPDD focuses on creating/strengthening of infrastructure for quality milk testing equipment as well as primary chilling facilities for State Cooperative Dairy Federations/ District Cooperative Milk Producers' Union/SHGs/Milk Producer Companies/Farmer Producer Organizations.
- (ii) The Component 'B' of the NPDD scheme "Dairying through Cooperatives" has the aim to increase sale of milk and dairy products by increasing farmer's access to organized market, upgrading dairy processing facilities and marketing infrastructure and enhancing the capacity of producer owned institutions, thereby contributing to increase in return to milk producers in the project area.

The detail of budget estimates/revised estimates and expenditure/releases to States under NPDD scheme during each of the last five years and current year (as on 20.07.2022) is as under:

- (b) An amount of Rs 919.75 lakh was released to Telangana State Dairy Development Cooperative Federation Limited (TDDFCL) under NPDD scheme during 2020-21.
- (c) State-wise allocation is not made under NPDD scheme. Budget allocations (BE) of Rs.255.00 core and Rs.340.10 crore were made during 2021-22 and 2022-23 respectively under NPDD scheme.

Department of Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Government of India is implementing following schemes/programmes to help boost up milk production and also help dairy farmers to get more income:-

- I. Rashtriya Gokul Mission
- II. National Programme for Dairy Development
- III. Dairy Processing and Infrastructure Development Fund
- IV. Supporting Dairy Cooperatives and Farmer Producer Organizations engaged in dairy activities
- V. Livestock Health & Disease Control Programme
- VI. National Livestock Mission
- VII. Animal Husbandry Infrastructure Development Fund

In addition, Government has extended Kisan Credit Card (KCC) facility to Animal Husbandry farmers and Fisheries farmers for their working capital requirements.

Beside above, efforts made by Government of Telangana and TDDCFL for improvement in milk production & to support milk producers are as under:

- (i) Providing encouragement to the milk producers by providing Rs 4/- per litre cash incentive.
- (ii) Launched Milch Animals Distribution Scheme by providing one milch animal to the members of Cooperative Societies at 75% subsidy to SC & ST beneficiaries and at 50% subsidy to others.
- (iii) Providing Rs 10,000/- back ended subsidy on purchase of milch animals through bank linkages and Rs 1000/- towards insurance of milch animals for overall improvement in milk production.
- (iv) Providing cattle feed and feed supplements on subsidy and health care to milch animals by conducting animal health and fertility camps
