1524. SHRI SUNIL BABURAO MENDHE:

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the salient features of Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) along with the details thereof;
- (b) the number of beneficiaries of the same, State and district-wise particularly in Maharashtra; and
- (c) the amount of funds allocated, disbursed and utilised for the same, State and district-wise particularly for Maharashtra?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT
(SADHVI NIRANJAN JYOTI)

(a) Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) is a placement linked skill development program for rural poor youth under National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM) since September, 2014. Rural Youth in the age group of 15-35 years are covered under this scheme. DDU-GKY guidelines provide for earmarking 50% of the funds for SCs and STs and 15% for minorities. Further, one third beneficiaries of the respective categories including general category covered under the scheme should be women.

DDU-GKY follows a 3-tier implementation architecture for implementation. National level is responsible for policy, funding of central share and technical support, while State Rural Livelihood Missions (SRLMs)/ State Skills Missions (SSMs) are responsible for funding of State share, implementation and monitoring controls. Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs), which are mostly private training partners, are responsible for mobilization, training and placements.

(b) The number of beneficiaries of DDU-GKY State-wise for last three years and current year is given at **Annexure-I**. District-wise number of beneficiaries of DDU-GKY of Maharashtra is given at **Annexure-II**.

(c) DDU-GKY Scheme is a demand driven scheme and no State-wise/ District-wise budget allocation is made. The State wise funds released/utilized data are given at **Annexure-III**. District-wise utilization details of Maharashtra State are given at **Annexure-IV**
